- On February 24, 2022, Ukraine was invaded. The suffering this has brought is immense. We are uniquely positioned to help with personnel, warehousing, and trucks in several relatively safe locations in central and western Ukraine.
- We are helping with immediate needs and are also focused on the longer term need of restoring and developing infrastructure. We believe in the future of a free and prosperous Ukraine. Close to \$7 mln has been deployed to date

Rebuilding the Food Chain

- ✓ We are working to **raise funds and deploy** them in **ag production and processing projects**.
- ✓ We use an extremely **efficient model** with almost 100% of funds going directly to projects that are **fully owned and operated by Ukrainian farmers and processors**.
- ✓ Often in the form of low interest, patient capital, this funding gives the recipient the flexibility to grow a food production business in adverse circumstances. The aim of the program is to make **green and clean technologies** available and deploy them on the ground.
- ✓ A board of Directors who have technical experience in the activities of the recipients, have a hands-on connection to ensure **best practices** are implemented and maintained.

New Focus

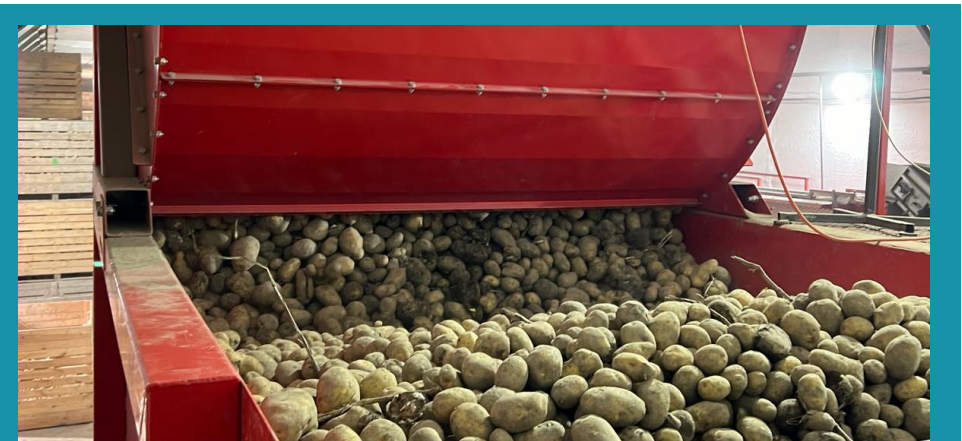


We have identified several agricultural production projects that we are throwing our weight behind. The current economic situation is causing the food production industry to falter. It is very difficult for these industries to survive, let alone improve and implement new and more efficient practices. They are as follows:

- 1) **Grain and potato production and processing** in the Zhytomyr region. A successful potato project was started in 2023 and we wish to help with irrigation, storage, and modern equipment. This project is owned and operated by Ukrainian farmers. Canadian experts from the potato industry in Prince Edward Island are overseeing this project. A potato processing plant is also being planned.
- 2) **Grain, cabbage and beet production** in the Kyiv region. Also owned and operated by Ukrainian farmers, this operation is currently struggling. We believe that in country processing is key to the future prosperity of these producers.

Contributions to these and other projects through our foundation will enable them to recover and build back solid, self-sustaining enterprises that will provide employment and contribute to the development of the local economies. Our current focus is in safer areas away from the front lines that have a strong agricultural base. These areas are critical to food security in Ukraine.

Rebuilding Ukraine's Potato Industry



- After attending the 2022 Rebuild Ukraine Conference in Toronto, Roland Thiessen partnered with Hon. Wayne Easter, Allan Parker & Razom Invest to bring Canadian potato growing expertise and technology to Ukraine
- Currently, Ukraine relies on European supply of good quality potato seeds.
- The joint project is aimed at rebuilding the Ukrainian potato industry and giving Ukraine an opportunity to become a certified seed potato supplier globally.

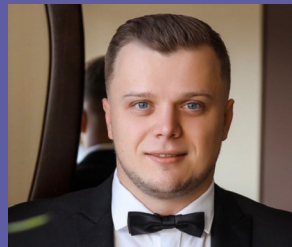

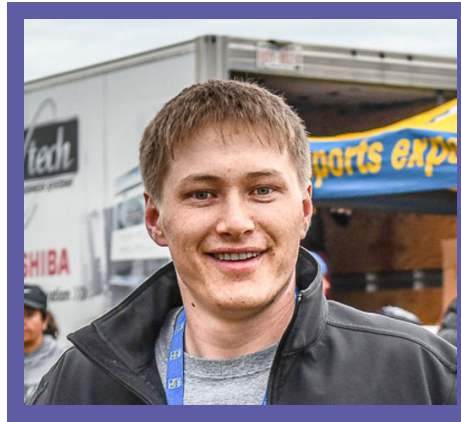
